Attention Year 6 – 11 students:

Secondary Students at Wongan Hills District High School are generously supported by local community service organisations and business (Apex, CWA, Rotary, Kanyanya – Wongan Hills Youth and Community Development Group, and the Shire of Wongan-Ballidu) through offering students the opportunity to apply for a range of scholarships to support them with their schooling endeavours at Wongan Hills District High School.

You are invited and encouraged to apply for as many scholarships as you like. However, please bear in mind that each student can only be awarded **one** scholarship.

#### **SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITIES**

#### 1. Kanyanya Scholarship Value \$500

(For a student commencing Year 7 to 10 in 2026)

To be awarded to a student who displays good citizenship and involvement in community projects.

#### 2. Shire of Wongan-Ballidu Scholarship

(For a student commencing Year 7 to 10 in 2026)

To be awarded to a student who displays a clear understanding of community needs by presenting their project or plan for a youth-oriented service, facility, activity or event within the Shire.

Value \$350.

#### 3. CWA Scholarship Value \$400

(For a student commencing Year 7 to 10 in 2026)

To be awarded to a student who shows enthusiasm and a high degree of skill in Technology and Enterprise.

#### 4. <u>Rotary Scholarship</u>

Value \$400.

(For a student commencing Year 7 to 10 in 2026)

To be awarded to a student who can demonstrate community involvement in school and the broader community, leadership potential and an above average academic ability.

#### 5. <u>Apex Club of Wongan Hills Scholarship</u> Value \$500.

(For a student commencing Year 11 or 12 in 2026)

To be awarded to a student who can clearly express the value of leadership in the school and the broader community.

#### **APPLICATION PROCESS:**

- 1. Complete criteria specified by the organisation.
- 2. Submit to the school office in person or via email to <a href="Wonganhills.dhs@education.wa.edu.au">Wonganhills.dhs@education.wa.edu.au</a> by the due date. All applications are then forwarded to the Principal and relevant organisation for shortlisting.
- 3. If shortlisted, undertake an interview with a representative from the organisation and the Principal.
