Interhouse Athletics Carnival

The Athletics Carnival is this **Friday 28th August.** All students are to meet at the Oval no later than 8.45am.

The weather forecast so far is looking fine so hopefully we don't have the issues we had last year. There is a significant amount of organisation that goes into a carnival and we also have the preparation for the Interschool carnival in a couple of weeks after our carnival. This year we have the additional planning meet the COVID-19 to requirements that are outlined for schools by the WA government. This will need everyone to cooperate to maintain physical distancing requirements. There have been spectator areas set up for the different events but under NO instances can we allow parents to join students in the bay areas. Staff and parent volunteers will be in fluoro top to identify them as helping with the day. There will be signage up to inform people what will be required as we want a positive day for everyone to enjoy.

Pre Primary and Kindergarten students will run their usual school program until 11 am when the Pre-Primary students will be bused to the town oval and the Kindergarten students will complete the usual program for the rest of the day.

Buses will run as normal, dropping Kindy and Pre-Primary students off at school first in the morning then proceeding to the Wongan Hills Sports Complex to drop all year 1 –12 bus students off.

The Carnival will finish at 3.00pm.

If you have not placed a lunch order for your child/ ren please pack them lunch and snacks.

Students are to wear House Shirts, navy bottoms and appropriate footwear. Dress up in house colours - body paint, zinc and hair spray is allowed.

Students will also need to bring a hat, water bottles, sunscreen and warm clothing if weather is cool or there is rain, and most importantly A POSITIVE ATTITUDE!

Parents in Classroom and Communication Policy

WONGAN WASTE WARRIOR'S Waste Sorting Stations

The Wongan Waste Warriors, otherwise known as the Primary Extension Group, have been busy introducing their new and improved waste sorting stations to staff and students over the past few weeks.

The group delivered fun and engaging presentations to the Junior, Upper Primary and secondary students and staff. The presentations included information about how and why students need to sort their waste in order to reduce the school's contribution to local landfill.

The four bin system, that includes Landfill, Recycle, Redcycle and Chook bucket, has been used in the undercover area for the past two years. The new and improved stations will now also be used in the upper primary and secondary eating areas as requested by students. The stations themselves are made from repurposed desk frames and coloured coded to help students separate their waste.


The Kaboom Kid
