## **Cookie Cutter**

Secondary students have been developing their skills to develop a new design of cookie cutter that represents a moment in human history. The process began with the Year 9/10 students who developed the concept and ideas for a symbol in English. Then, the concept was given to a Year 7/8 student to design and create using the 3D printer. Finally, the cutters were tested in Home Economics.

STEM thinking requires a creative approach to solving challenges and developing new ways of doing things. The cutters were not just a fun thing to make, but a challenge to ensure the meaning of the symbol was not made unrecognisable by changing the design. It's one thing to be creative to design a symbol, another to develop a way to communicate it.
